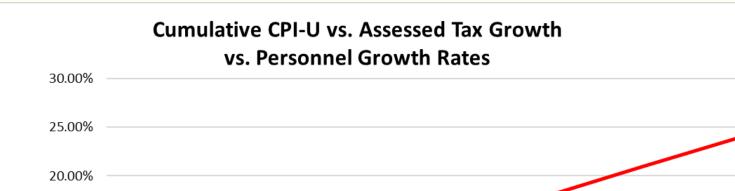
#### Berks County Commissioners' 2024 Budget Goals

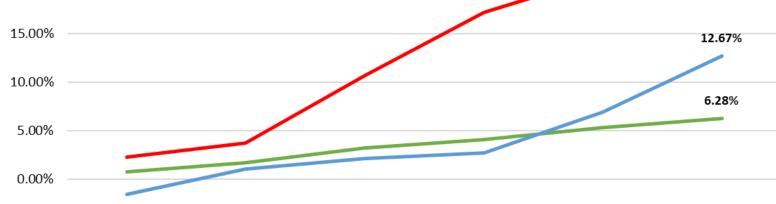
- No property tax increase

- Maintain long term financial stability
- Prioritize capital improvement to:

#### **Berks County 2024 Budget Highlights**

- Interest increases: \$4.1M on reserves and \$2.5M ARP
- Headcount Decrease 48 FTE primarily closure of BCRC
- Wage Increase \$4.9M/3.76%
  - Comparatively Sept. CPI-U 3.7%/ECI State & Local Gov. 4.8%
  - Decreases FTE reduction \$3.8M/Turnover \$0.7M
  - Increases competitive adjustments \$4.8M/Base COLA \$4.6M
- Net Fringe Benefit Increase \$1.1M or 2.7% excluding Pension
- Pension ADC increase \$3.9M market value of pension assets
- Debt Service \$14.3M No new debt, decrease of (\$2.1M)
- Human Svc/911Support \$14.4M Increase \$0.4M
- Maintains the following commitment to:
  - Economic Development \$1.0M (Personnel/Business outreach/GRCA\$500K)
  - Library System \$3.9M includes \$900K to RPL
  - Parks System \$5.8M Operations and park improvements (capital)
  - SCTA/BARTA \$499K Sponsor, 5% increase to maximize state funding
  - RACC \$3.25M Sponsor, operating stipend plus \$1.0M Redevelopment Authority (RDA)
  - BCPS \$164K R3 Pre-Apprentice program plus \$50K RDA and \$300K Whole Home Repair Grant
  - COCA \$1.425M Drug and alcohol treatment plus \$300k RDA

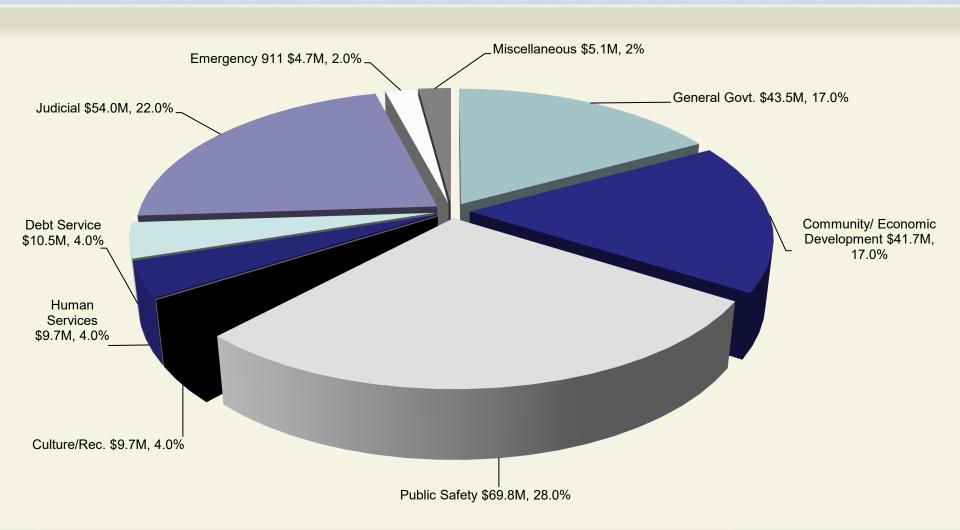

#### **Berks County 2024 Budget Potential Risks/Rewards**

- Berks Heim impacts:
  - Berks Heim Census growth 305 to 340 during 2023 (currently 305)
  - Staffing, agency, and O.T. costs
  - Tight labor market (availability)
  - Continuation of IGT program Berks Heim
- Inflation and interest rate impacts on:
  - CBA wage negotiations
  - Healthcare costs
  - Interest earned rate changes
  - Pension assets performance and value at 12.31.23 (assume \$475M)
- Headcount changes and enrollment in healthcare plans
  - Claim trend worker comp & health costs (benefit from higher vacancies)
- State budget cuts & unfunded mandates
- Growth in Jail ADP (782 at 9/30/2023)
- County of Berks run shelter care facility and youth detention center
- 9-1-1 fee renewal or sunset
- Debt guarantees
- New funding for discretionary programs
